



Nowadays, the world we live in is getting more and more complex. That's why we created the GRIFF collection that explores difficult topics, aimed at teenagers and young adults.

Presented like graphic and illustrated novels, the books of this collection deal with engaged themes, feminism and controversy. The goal is not to shock people but to open their eyes on certain topics and to accompany the reader on societal thinking.

The two first books are decidedly feminist. *The four seasons of Elfina* tells the story of a young lady hosted by her aunt and uncle that gets confined to the house to deal with housekeeping.

Why are girls sick and tired? is a feminist manifesto that reports the discomfort that women experience, from their childhood to their adulthood in a society that doesn't spare them.





The Four Seasons of Eflina



Elfina is twelve years old. As she lived with her grand-mother in a remote village of Paraguay, her aunt Evoala offered to take her along with her and her family when moving to Montreal. But Elfina won't go to school and her life turned into hell. She found herself completely enslaved by her family. But one day, she will manage to free herself...

A truthful story on the reality of millions of children in the world, in the form of a graphic novel.
